## MECKLENBURG AREA CATHOLIC SCHOOLS

In 1992, the Charlotte-area parish schools consolidated into the Mecklenburg Area Catholic Schools system to improve the quality of education our children receive and ensure that an outstanding Catholic education is available to more children in our community.

Before the formation of MACS, the Catholic schools in Mecklenburg County were:

Our school system has seen enrollment grow from 2,420 original students to more than 4,634 students this year. Today, we are a school system of nine Catholic schools, serving grades PK through 12 in Mecklenburg County. Our schools are co-educational and fully accredited.

• Charlotte Catholic High School (9-12)

• St. Ann (PK, TK, K-5)

• Christ the King Catholic High School (9-12)

• St. Gabriel (K-5)

Holy Trinity Catholic Middle School (6-8)

• Our Lady of the Assumption (PK, K-8)

• St. Patrick (K-5)

St. Mark (K-8)

MACS established a capital fee in 1992 that is paid annually by each school family. The capital fee has helped to finance the construction and renovation of our schools for almost 30 years, with more than \$67 million invested in our schools since 1992. The major additions and renovations include:



- New construction of Our Lady of the Assumption
- Extensive renovations at St. Patrick
- Extensive renovations at St. Ann
- Purchase of an office building on Highway 51 and conversion to CCHS
- Renovation of the old CCHS campus into the new Holy Trinity Catholic Middle School

- New construction of St. Mark
- · New construction St. Matthew
- New construction of Christ the King Catholic High School
- New parking deck construction and stadium renovations at CCHS
- · Renovations at Holy Trinity
- · Holy Trinity classroom addition
- Holy Trinity gym and cafeteria improvements







#### HONORING THE TRADITION

Charlotte Catholic is rooted in an educational program that began in 1887 as St. Mary's Seminary, led by the Sisters of Mercy and located downtown beside St. Peter Catholic Church. Growth at St. Mary's led to the founding of the O'Donoghue School. Continued growth led to relocation of grades 9-12 to a new campus on Park Road in 1955, which was named Charlotte Catholic High School. Our Lady of Mercy was created as an all-girls high school in 1961, but the boys' and girls' schools were rejoined in 1968, once again as Charlotte Catholic High School, and led by the Sisters of Mercy. Enrollment continued to increase, and in 1995, CCHS relocated to its current location on Highway 51.

Our tradition of great community support has led directly to our growth and success. Our generous supporters and our parishes provide vital tuition assistance and support for our schools. As we continue to provide our students with the best possible Catholic education, please know that we are grateful for the many ways that you make our Catholic schools a better place.



Charlotte Catholic High School is an educational community centered in the Roman Catholic faith, which teaches individuals to serve as Christians in our changing world.

Since Charlotte Catholic High School relocated to its current campus, our Catholic community has recognized the need for a dedicated space for the performing and visual arts that would fully serve our students along their educational journey.



The master plan developed for CCHS includes a fine arts center.

CCHS moved to its new location on Pineville-Matthews Road. Renovations at CCHS include the media center expansion, addition of 16 classrooms, cafeteria expansion, custodial/storage expansion, and the addition of the Chapel.

The *Expanding the Vision, Honoring the Tradition* Capital Campaign captures our vision and will truly transform our future, shaping not only current and future students, but the entire Charlotte Catholic community.

Today, our schools offer everything from chorus to band to theater to the visual arts. Our students consistently secure local, regional, and national recognition for excellence in the arts. While our programs thrive, the space to support our students' development of their God-given talents remains limited. To fulfill our mission and address these needs, we must provide a fine arts center that will be used by all MACS students and available to the broader community.

Our plans provide a beautiful 21st century building where our students can refine and demonstrate their skills in the visual and performing arts. All fine arts classes will relocate to this new building, freeing up existing spaces that will be renovated for classroom use and for athletics. Plans include a new weight room, a new wrestling room, and classrooms for teachers who currently do not have them. We then can ensure a well-rounded high school experience for ALL of our students.

Combined with the MACS Capital Fee contribution of \$15 million, reaching the \$8 million Campaign Goal will provide a total investment of \$23 million. This will complete both Phase 1 and Phase 2 of the Fine Arts Center construction.

Phase 1


Phase 1 will construct a new Theater, Band Room, Choral Room, Concessions Space, Drama Classroom, Dance Studio, Ensemble Room, Lobby, and Set Construction Space, plus Dressing Rooms, Side Stages, and more.

Phase 2 will construct Art Studios, a Black Box Catwalk, a Digital Lab, a Ceramics Studio, Faculty Workshop Space, a Photography Lab, a 60' Fly Tower, and more.

When our fine arts classes relocate to the new building, existing spaces in the current school building will be freed up. These spaces will be renovated for classroom use and for athletics. Plans include a new Weight Room, a new Wrestling Room, and classrooms for teachers who currently do not have them.



Appreciated Stocks and Securities: Giving securities that have increased in value may allow you to take the current market price as a tax deduction. You will owe no income tax or capital gains tax on the increase.

Real Estate: Gifts of real estate, including personal residences, vacation homes, commercial properties, farms, and unimproved land, may provide exceptional tax benefits for the donor while providing support for the school. Gifts of real estate will be considered on a case by case basis.
